Palace Senftenberg Fortress

Saxony's fortress in Brandenburg is ready to be conquered!

Until 1815, Senftenberg was a Saxon fortress that was supposed to protect Dresden from the Prussians. Yet history often doesn't go to plan and the fortress was 'moved' to Brandenburg. Conquer this fortress, unique in Germany, and explore its secret passage, powder tower and postern gate! The palace exhibition shows why Senftenberg was always a border town and why here, of all places, a small castle was turned into a renaissance palace and a mighty fortress.

History of the region

The permanent exhibition takes you on an exciting journey through time into the **history of Lusatia**, where you can get to know **Senftenberg** as a city with its Sorbian roots, medieval splendour, mining tradition and new start in the 21st century. Discover its historical gems, from the town's oldest fire department and a huge wine press to a precious church inventory. Take a seat in the classroom at one of the wooden school desks from the last century.

From mining sites to the Lusatian Lakeland





Discover the artistic side of Lusatia

Painting, graphic art and sculpture – Lusatia is a lively place for art. An exquisite art collection has been amassed in Senftenberg since the 1980s, with over 2,500 works by more than 130 artists. This is a great insider tip – and not just for art lovers. What is most special, is that every work has a connection to Lusatia. The permanent exhibition contains an exciting collection of art works from the 20th and 21st century, including artists such as Carl Lohse and Elisabeth Wolf.

Special exhibitions of contemporary Lusatian artists

The **temporary exhibitions** showcase contemporary Lusatian artists and their work. These artists engage with everyday life in their art and explore themes that characterise the region.

Museum store meets Spreewald Railway

Come on a journey through time and immerse yourself in the everyday hustle and bustle of a Spreewald town as it looked 150 years ago, when the scents of exotic products like coffee, cocoa and spices wafted through the colonial goods store. Take a look into the historical **businesses and skilled-craft** parlours of local tradespeople, from the baker, all the way to the shoemaker. Weigh, measure, weave – at the various adventure stations you can handle and try out the tradesman's tools. What's more, a small but wonderful collection of art works gives you an insight into the golden age of Spreewald painting.

The historical Spreewald Railway will set the heart of every technology fan racing! The Spreewald, or 'woods of the river Spree', was a secluded area up until the the 19th century. Many remote locations could only be reached using waterways. The railway opened up the region to entirely new opportunities. Commandeer the engine driver's cabin of the original steam locomotive 995703 and have a look at the old instruments, or make yourself comfortable in the wooden compartments of the passenger and luggage carriages from 1897.

Welcome to the 19th Century!

Visit the oldest open-air museum in Brandenburg and discover 19th century life in the Spreewald. Our staff will welcome you clad in the traditional dress of Spreewald and take you to the four historical farms that originate from different regions of the Spreewald. In 1904, Lehde's local fire department was founded. Discover its historical fire extinguishing methods for the first time in our museum.

Pure nature in the farm garden

Take a break from the bustle of daily life and enjoy the shade of the local fruit trees. Smell and sample local flowers, herbs and crops in the farm garden or discover typical Spreewald specialties such as **cucumbers** and **spicy horseradish** in the old horseradish mill.





Adventure areas for the whole family

In the adventure areas the whole family can have a go at doing those old-fashioned chores that used to be part of everyday life: at the open air laundry you can wash clothes white again with soap and a washboard. Practice **milking** in the cowshed or try walking around in wooden clogs. With a bit of skill you can even build your own Spreewald house! Discover children's games of days gone by or dream sweet dreams in a soft **bed of hay** and listen to Spreewald sayings.

Discover regional diversity and Spreewald traditions explore the Lehde Open-Air Museum by taking a discovery tour through its farmyards, or take part in a workshop to learn historical handicraft techniques, from spinning yarn to blue dying. You will be enchanted by the unique markets and atmospheric events, such as the Nights of Light or Spreewald Christmas. Discover regional specialities in the museum shops.

Weddings and celebrations

In the Lehde Open-Air Museum you can get married in historical chic. You will be received in the traditional manner with bread and salt in the lovingly decorated wedding room, and hold a toast at the champagne **reception** in the fruit garden. Enjoy an unforgettable day in the Spreewald and celebrate with us! Whether for private or business entertainment – enchant your guests at your special event with this unique historical ambience.
